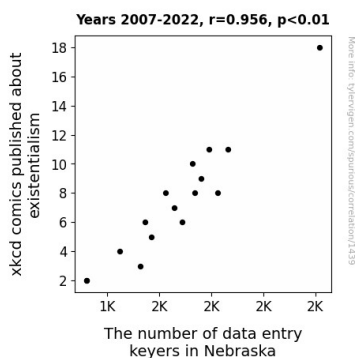
## RESULTS
